Parish Council News

On behalf of the Parish Council may we wish all parishioners a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! I would also like to extend our thanks to the editorial staff of this magazine and to all the volunteers who run our clubs and events that make living in Moulton such a pleasure.

Vehicle Activated Speeding Sign – for the past few months the flashing sign could not be put up on the newly erected post on Newmarket Road, due to Health & Safety concerns, however we hope these have now been addressed and we will benefit from having a regular reminder to those vehicles that still speed into the village. The Community Speed Watch team are now sharing their equipment with Kentford. Ongoing checks are carried out on a regular basis so make sure you watch your speed.

SOCIAL HOUSING A Local Lettings Policy for all social housing within the parish had now been put in place and will run for a year. It will be reviewed to see if has achieved its objectives and a decision will be taken whether to continue with the policy after this time.

A number of properties are due to become vacant at Farriers Grange and we recommend to anyone with local ties, in need of housing, to contact the District Council in order to be placed on the housing register.

FOOTBALL PITCH Currently the goals have been taped off, and plastic goals repositioned on the

pitch for practice. The reason for this move is to prevent undue wear to the main playing pitch area we would ask that you all keep an eye out to ensure that these temporary goals are looked after as they belong to the Panthers and would be very expensive to replace. While thinking about this area it has been reported that an unleashed dog is often seen walking with its owner across the playing field. We would request that if you see this please ask them to respect the regulations and insist that their dog is put on a lead, however well behaved it may be.

HIGHWAY MATTERS Cheveley/Dalham Road junction – erosion of verge - Cllr Lisa Chambers has generously agreed to finance the kerbing and bank repairs from her locality budget. At the same time we have asked that the surface is renewed outside the shop and at the Newmarket Rd/Street junction though we have been told that it is not likely to be completed until the New Year.

The above items are some of the things we have been working on recently but our main concern is still the vast amounts of new housing proposed in the area and the effects that this will have on our daily lives, we are continuing the fight to ensure that the necessary infrastructure is provided to ensure our communities remain sustainable.

Once we all recover from the Christmas festivities it is back to reality as our financial year ends. 2014 has not been a good year as far as finances have been concerned; it becomes harder as our income falls. This will mean for the first time in many years we, along with other churches, will not be able to fulfil our parish share (the payment to the Diocese for the services they provide eg the Rectors salary). If this trend continues there is a possibility that services at St Peter's will diminish, hopefully we will do all we can to maintain all services but we will need help.

Early in the New Year we hope to start phase 2 of our project, which itself will be in two parts, firstly the removal and relocation, within the Church, of the back pews to create a community space. Also, to bring from behind the vestry curtain and mount on the wall the Medieval Sheela-na-gig, a stone carving from the Norman period. Following this we hope to be able to install the toilet and small kitchen beneath the tower, funds willing!

PILGRIMS IN TIME 1914 - 2014 - 2114

The Service of Holy Communion that launched the Centenary of the Diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich was a truly wonderful occasion at the Cathedral in March this year.

Children, students and teachers from across Suffolk schools had created stunning art work that brought a vibrancy to the interior. The use of colour, music, liturgical dance and drama demonstrated so clearly the energy and enthusiasm of our younger church members as they expressed thanks and praise to God.

Beautiful and memorable music is always a feature of a service like this, none more-so than to have the entire congregation join in the Centenary Song specially written by Andrew and Wendy Rayner.

In place of the sermon The Archbishop of Canterbury answered questions prepared by some of the young people. He answered honestly, poignantly, with humility and humour. He took them seriously and his responses were powerful.

In the words of Bishop David "A pilgrimage is a journey into the unknown and perhaps the unexpected, but led by the light of Christ and held by his grace."

Our own Flower Festival in June celebrated the centenary of the diocese but also marked the commemoration of the beginning of WW1. The displays of photographs with biographical detail created a sensitive memorial to those who served so courageously. The floral arrangements and stunning decorations gave our visitors and villagers another viewpoint of St Peter's Church.

We hope to see you again in 2015.



We are encouraging people wherever possible to subscribe online to Police Connect but if you have neighbours who do not have a computer, please ask them to subscribe by ringing the team on 101. I am still awaiting supply of Registration Forms but they are available at Police Station Front Desks and also from your Safer Neighbourhood Team if you need them.

The new service, which has now replaced the old Police Direct service from November 1, is called Police Connect and continues to offer free updates direct from the police by e-mail, text or phone. Suffolk and Norfolk Constabularies have joined forces to save money and provide you with even more flexibility on the type and location for the messages you receive.

As ever, you get to choose to receive information on the matters and places most important to you.

Either go to www.suffolk.police.uk/policeconnect or alternatively you call the Police Connect Team on between 8am and 4pm Monday to Friday on

01473 613997 or e-mail policeconnect@suffolk.pnn.police.uk

If you are not registered already, don't panic, you can still register for the service at any time via www.suffolk.police.uk/policeconnect [as above] or by picking up a registration form from your local police public enquiry office. Why do I have to re-register? To make sure all subscribers to the service are getting the best out of it, tailored to their needs, it will be necessary for everyone to re-register, so we have the right information about you and what you want from Police Connect. We have made this a simple task, and it will only take a few moments of your time. Reminders were sent out via Police Direct but as of November 1st all updates will be issued via Police Connect.

Christmas is coming!

Christmas is an exciting time of year for all the family and I'm sure many of our pets will be getting presents wrapped under the tree. However we must also remember that many Christmas treats can be poisonous to dogs and must be kept out of reach. Here's a list of a few definite things to avoid:

Raisins - can cause kidney failure, so avoid Christmas pudding or mice pies and be careful not to leave cake ingredients sitting on the edge of work surfaces.

Chocolate - it is well known that chocolate is toxic to dogs. Make sure that any chocolate tree decorations are high up out of your dog's reach. If you want to give your dog a special treat there are plenty of companies that sell special "doggy" chocolate that is safe for dogs to eat.

Onions - onions are toxic to both dogs and cats. Onions are often a key ingredient for stuffing to accompany your Christmas turkey, be careful if you are giving your pet table scraps and think carefully about what you are actually giving them.

Macadamia nuts - even in a small quantity. They can cause depression, vomiting and a dangerously high heart rate.



Next year will be a particularly significant one for RSPB Lakenheath Fen, as the reserve will celebrate its twentieth birthday on 31 October 2015. On the eve of the beginning of this very important year, I would like to ask you all a question: have you ever visited us before? If you have, that's fantastic news and if you haven't, why not come and visit during the coming festive season?

Now, I know that Christmas is a busy time and the weather isn't always great. However, if you do feel the urge to take a break from the festive rush, why not come and visit for the first time? The reserve is open at all times and there are circular walks of up to four miles around the various trails.

If you are into wildlife, there are two viewpoint shelters and a wildlife watching hide. December is a great time month to see birds of prey, especially the marsh harriers that call the reserve home. We have two resident pairs of barn owls, which are often seen hunting in the afternoon near the visitor centre. The resident kingfishers should also be around, as long as the reserve pools aren't too frozen.

There are some fantastic views from the reserve's viewpoints and as the reserve is on an east-west axis, we are often treated to some fantastic sunsets, so don't forget your camera!

On the subject of cameras, if Father Christmas brings you a new one on the "big day", why not come and try it out at the reserve? Whether it is a compact or a digital SLR, there are plenty of photographic opportunities so why not come and get creative?! The visitor centre will be closed 24-31 December but the toilets will be open daily 27-31 December. We will then reopen on New Years Day, when we will usher in our anniversary year in style!


