

Colin is on the move again. Having finished his time at Stoke Mandeville Spinal Hospital he is now due to move to Royal Buckinghamshire Independent Rehabilitation centre for intensive physiotherapy in order to retain and improve his level of strength and capability before returning home, hopefully early next year..

Jerry and I visited him recently at Soke Mandeville and he was very chirpy and able to move around the hospital in a self propelled wheelchair—he does have an electric wheelchair for long journeys but feels it is cheating using it around the wards and prefers to build his stamina by self propelling.

Work has started on the necessary alterations to his home but this will take some time so Colin is unlikely to be home before early next year and then another set of challenges awaits.

Returning home after 9+ months in hospital must be wonderful but then the realisation that everything has changed and neither he nor his home is as it was when he left that fateful Saturday morning for a bike ride!

We will all be so pleased to see him home but then life begins a very different chapter for not just Colin but Shirley too! We send them both all our love.

The Future of Moulton Matters

The cost of producing Moulton Matters, like everything else, has increased and so we have had to put our advertising rates up by 10%.

The revenue from advertising must cover the printing of 4 issues—currently it does not and we have to keep dipping into Community pots. We lost a lot of advertisers following Covid, many of them went out of business and we need to get back up to that pre-Covid level.

As you will see from the above report, Colin is doing very well and soon to return home however we have discussed his continued participation with Moulton Matters and reluctantly he does not think he is able to assist me much with setting up. Moulton Parish Council Report

A meeting of Moulton Parish Council took place on Monday 18th September 2023. County Councillor Andy Drummond and District Councillor Roger Dicker attended the meeting. Minutes of the meeting are available on the Parish Council's website.

Moulton Housing Needs Survey

The results of the Housing Needs Survey showed that Moulton has a higher portion of 4+ bedroom homes and a lower portion of 1 and 2 bedroom homes than is typical in England. House prices in Moulton are 9 times the median workplace income making them unaffordable for those on lower than median incomes. The survey results showed that 70% of households that responded would support a small developed of affordable homes for Moulton Residents with small family homes, housing for older people and 1-2 bedroom homes for couples the most popular. Councillors on the Housing working group met Sue Downs from Community Action Suffolk to discuss the way forward and will be presenting its suggestions at the November meeting. If the decision is made to proceed, a steering group of Moulton residents would need to be set up to move the project forward. If you are interested in getting involved, please let the clerk or one of our councillors know.

Planning applications for the former Animal Health Trust site

Moulton Parish Council received 33 planning applications for 203 homes on the former Animal Health Trust site. Most of the applications for Lanwades Park were made under General Permitted Development rules which means that they did not follow the normal planning process and all the normal material considerations used to decide on the merits of an application are not taken into account. Moulton Parish Council objected to the applications and has subsequently found out that West Suffolk Council has issued a Refusal of Certificate of Existing Lawful Use as it does not believe that the site meets the criteria for General Permitted Development regulations.

Boy's Grave junction on the B1506

This junction has been the site of a number of accidents in recent years. Moulton Parish Council asked Suffolk County Council (SCC) Highways to check the signs at the junction to make sure that none were missing. One Give Way has been ordered for replacement. Some of the directional signs are also missing but as they are not mandatory signs, SCC has tentatively scheduled them for replacement in

2024/25. Moulton Parish Council is looking into the feasibility of funding the signs themselves with contributions from County Councillor Andy Drummond and Kentford Parish Council.

Speeding is also a concern at the junction and Moulton Parish Council asked if SCC would consider reducing the speed limit along this section of the B1506. Suffolk County Council's Safety and Speed team have confirmed that a 40mph limit would not be considered here, regardless of the results of any speed survey, as this location does not meet the majority of their criteria for a 40 mph reduction to a national speed limit carriageway. They have advised that a 50mph zone from Kennett, extending to the Newmarket side of the crossroads is more likely to be approved but this would be strictly dependent on the outcome of a speed survey and any recommendations that are made. There would have to be either a very high volume of speeding traffic here or other exceptional circumstances involved before any reduction would be considered here (the collision records here alone are insufficient for this) and Suffolk Police do not currently consider this a site where they recommend a speed reduction. Moulton Parish Council has arranged an initial speed survey with the cost shared between Moulton PC, County Councillor Andy Drummond and Kentford Parish Council.

Update on the 20's Plenty for Suffolk campaign

Moulton Parish Council's request for a review of 20mph speed limits in Suffolk has been refused by Suffolk County Council. They will only implement 20mph speed limits on a detailed case-by-case basis through the well-established Traffic Regulation Orders, where special local circumstances apply, proven by data and surveys. The cost of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) is at least £5,000 in addition to the cost of speed surveys which would have to be funded by the Parish Council. A TRO and traffic survey would be required for each road, making the cost prohibitive for rural parishes. Moulton Parish Council agreed to challenge this response and push for more enforcement as well as they would like to work with Suffolk County Council to make communities safer and reduce speeds in parts villages where vehicles and people mix and especially where there are no pavements.

Finance

Councillors reviewed the Parish Council's expenditure to date against the budget for 2023/24. The budget is currently on track.





Six wildlife highlights to look for in December

December is a time of year when some of us will be busy preparing, shopping and organising ahead of the festivities at the end of the month, but some people prefer things quieter or simpler. As always, wildlife will be ever present in our lives and I hope that no matter how you spend the month, the list of highlights below will help you enjoy the month:

1. Harrier roosts in reedbeds

If you have a reedbed nature reserve nearby, such as at RSPB Lakenheath Fen or the National Trust's Wicken Fen, it's worth paying a visit at dusk to look for raptors roosting-these should mainly be Marsh harriers but if you are lucky you may also see Hen harrier joining them too. It can be really exciting watching these beautiful birds of prey come in from all directions just as the light is fading; to glide over the reeds and then drop into their favoured spot for the night.

2. Lesser redpoll and Siskin on bird feeders

If you have Goldfinches visiting your garden bird feeders, you may also spot a couple of other finches which only visit for the colder months. Both Siskin and Lesser redpolls are smaller- roughly Blue tit-sized, but very different in plumage. Siskin are a streaky yellow and black in males, with female birds more greenish in colour. Lesser redpoll are a mixture of cream and grey with black streaks and a small red patch on their forehead. Males have a red/pink flush to their breast which varies quite a bit in intensity.

3. Mistle thrushes beginning to sing

In quiet areas with tall trees surrounding open farmland or parkland, you may hear the beautiful, haunting warble of a Mistle thrush. They are roughly the size of Jackdaws and their song a repeated short tune, often going on for half an hour or more. They breed early- often laying eggs in February- so their singing starts early too!

4. Jays collecting acorns

These colourful members of the crow family will be busy carrying acorns- up to six at a time- to spots to bury them ready for Spring. Then, when the Jays have hungry chicks to feed, using their amazing memory they'll return to the burial site, pull up the seedling and snip off the fat first pair of leaves ('seed leaves') to feed to their youngsters.

5. Corvid roosts in tall trees

Whilst Carrion crows are solitary, Rooks and Jackdaws will nest and roost communally and these roosting sites can number thousands of birds. If you see corvids flying overhead as the light begins to fade, try to see where they end up- they'll take you to their roost. If it's in a public area, then pause a while underneath as darkness falls to watch them swirling, lifting and settling again in a noisy rabble. All this communication is thought to be the birds reinforcing bonds and keeping up-to-date about good feeding spots.

6. Keep an eye on the 'Northern lights'

Believe it or not, every now and again it's possible to see the Aurora Borealis where we live. Keep an eye on this website https://aurorawatch.lancs.ac.uk/ or download the 'AuroraWatch' app if you are able- these track the Earth's geomagnetic activity hour by hour, and if it's dark and clear where you are at the time of a 'Red' alert, you're in with a chance. If you can find somewhere with a clear view towards the northern horizon, away from major sources of light pollution, like towns and industrial areas, you'll have the best luck.
