Dear Reader - Update on Colin!

Colin was moved to Stoke Mandeville Spinal Rehabilitation Hospital shortly after our last publication in June.

It took him a few weeks to settle in to a different environment and regime but once he felt comfortable being there it has been a very busy time for him. There is lots more physio and occupational therapy and most days Colin is exhausted from the effort required but he pushes on!

Improvements are being made, slowly but surely. There is unfortunately not much improvement in Colin's left side (both leg and hand) but his right leg and fingers of his right hand are becoming more flexible. He has even been on the computer using a mouse!

Colin now spends longer sitting up in a wheelchair and had been taken down to the garden and café by visitors. Jerry and I visited recently and did just that. We found the garden café a delightful place—it was like being in a coffee shop having a catch up! He is awaiting a new electric wheel chair which I am sure will have him whizzing around the wards and corridors., however they have just given Colin a light weight self propel wheelchair and on the first day he was able to propel himself up and down the ward on his own! Absolutely brilliant Colin!

Visitors are welcome but have to fit in with Colins regime—they can watch him at work in the physio room etc. Shirley recently took some photos of Colin in a standing machine, he was in a harness for support which is electronically controlled by the physio—it made him very dizzy at first having spent 5 months laid up in bed but he is getting there!

It is a very long and difficult journey to get to the unit which is near Aylesbury so Shirley goes off early one day, stays over night in a nearby hotel and spends the second day with Colin until after tea and then returns home. Other visitors fit around her.

Last week it was Colins birthday and Shirley was able to take Colin down to the café and meet up with his 6 year old grandson and family members and they could even have candles on the birthday cake (candles are not permitted in the wards!).

The very latest news is that Colin is doing so well he has been moved down stairs in the unit to a another ward where there is more equipment and flexibility as well as access to the hydro pool—great progress!

Keep up the excellent work Colin—we are all rooting for you..

We send them our love and urge Shirley to keep going and stay strong—our thoughts remain with you both. Jill Goodwin

Moulton Parish Council report

A meeting of Moulton Parish Council took place on Monday 17th July 2023. County Councillor Andy Drummond and District Councillor Roger Dicker attended along with six members of the public.

Public session.

The main issues raised during the public session were:

The possible use of the playing field by Moulton Vets.

The response from Suffolk Police and Suffolk County Council to complaints about the decision not to allow a 40mph speed limit on the section leading into Moulton on Newmarket Road.

Loss of road markings in Brookside which have not been replaced.

Report by County Councillor Andy Drummond.

Andy Drummond spoke about the following:

The change in the make-up of West Suffolk Council since the May elections.

He supported the speed reduction in Newmarket Road but it was rejected and there was no right of appeal, which he was not happy about.

He agreed to ask Highways to reinstall the missing signs at the Boy's Grave junction and ask about the white markings at the junction of Brookside and Gazeley Road.

District Council report.

Cllr Roger Dicker spoke about the following:

He has been appointed as Chair of West Suffolk Council.

He explained the make-up of West Suffolk Council following the elections. The hope is there will be a better deal for communities in the former Forest Heath area.

Community Chest Fund applications are now open.

West Suffolk Local Plan.

The Local Plan is currently being reviewed. The final consultation will now be in January 2024. The plan will come into effect in 2025.

Update on road safety improvements in Moulton.

New planters have been installed near Moulton Crossroads. Black and white chevrons will be attached to the front of each planter as an additional reminder to drivers about the junction. Moulton Parish Council would like to thank Moulton in Bloom for planting them with perennials.

An advanced Give Way sign will be installed in Newmarket Road as soon as the contractor can schedule in the work.

The village entrance gates have been installed, however Moulton Parish Council has been made aware that the 30mph roundels are too small and replacements have been ordered.

Speeding

Moulton Parish Council took part in a webinar held by the organisation 20's Plenty in Suffolk which is campaigning to reduce the speed limits in rural communities and towns to 20mph. Moulton Parish Council decided to sign up for the '20 is Plenty for Suffolk' scheme with a view to starting a county wide conversation about speeding and speed limits in Suffolk.

Update on the Housing Needs Survey.

The return rate was 33%. The draft summary report is being prepared by Community Action Suffolk and should be ready for the September meeting.

Update on the proposal for a new village sign.

The village sign working group has agreed that the artwork for the new village sign will be the Packhorse Bridge, the River Kennet and its features. The proposed sign would be double sided to maximise the visibility from all four approaches at the Crossroads and installed on a free standing oak post.

The next stage is to test out ideas in sketch form to see what can practically be included in the space available and assess the visual impact.

Next meeting.

The next meeting of Moulton Parish Council will take place on Monday 18th September at 6.40pm in the Lanwades room in Moulton Village Hall. Please use the outside entrance which can be accessed via the playing field.



From Rev Chris Childs

High Places and Gates

We are much indebted to a generous parishioner for the provision of a beautiful new wrought iron gate at the east end of the churchyard. It enables more people to make the circular walk as the long serving stile had proved an insurmountable barrier to some. The more adventurous may climb to the heights of Primrose Hill and delight in the view of Ely Cathedral to the north and give perspective to our own village to the west.

The 6th August was the Feast of the Transfiguration (Luke 9 28-36) where we hear of Jesus in the company of 3 disciples changing to dazzling brightness on a high mountain. It was a defining moment for the 3 disciples as they literally saw him 'in a different light'.

Many people seek spiritual or physical 'highs' in their lives because they believe they bring satisfaction and enjoyment. We all see things 'in a different light' from a 'high place' whether metaphorical or not because it puts much of our lives into perspective.

Of course we cannot spend our entire lives on a high nor indeed do we want to spend them in the depths of despair but there is a value in taking yourself outside the ordinary and looking 'on/in'. Might you climb the heights of Primrose Hill? Will it give you an insight?

But we don't want to rush into action from the new insights gained.

There were a few who suggested that no gate replace the stile. Those who have stood outside St Peter's well know that is not wise as on occasions significant numbers of runners literally pour down on top of us enjoying the downhill run! The gate gives some 'protection' and it is important in other ways too.

As we move in our lives from 'highs' to 'lows' we need a gatekeeper to check our flow and give us balance. The gate will do that literally just as in our daily lives we all need a trusted friend or partner to say — 'Hang on — what's all this about' before we go diving off into perhaps reckless adventures or wallowing in the 'slough of despair'. Our loving father God often appears in the shape of a friend (angel — some would say) to guide and support us as we journey on - but we all need to *seek* the 'high lands' and look and see what our life is about.

You will all be most welcome to join those who seek the 'high lands' of the life God has promised us all – Life in all its richness (John Ch 10 v10) in church each Sunday

Moulton Community Speed Watch

The aim of Community Speed Watch is to help reduce the amount of speeding traffic in the village. We hope our presence helps with this goal but we still see a significant number of vehicles travelling at unacceptable speeds in the village.

We are all aware that it is sometimes difficult to avoid marginally exceeding a speed limit but some of the speeds we see obviously indicate there is no intent to adhere to the limit which is disappointing and worrying for the safety of everyone. Newmarket Road is particularly concerning as the speeds measured are significantly over the limit for vehicles both entering and leaving the village.

It is noticeable that a number of drivers seem totally oblivious to the surroundings and do not even seem to be aware of us carrying out speed checks!

The Speed Watch team appreciates the positive comments from residents who understand and appreciate our aims, we also occasionally receive helpful comments from motorists!

We would like to expand our activities to help make Moulton safer and would really like to have the help of additional volunteers. Please let me know if you would like to help or have any questions or feedback about our activities.

GRASS SEED SEASON!!

These pesky little blighters manage to cause a lot of discomfort to you dogs at this time of year when they find themselves in unfortunate places. Please make sure to check between your dog's toes after walks. Especially if you own spaniels, poodle crosses or anything with very hairy feet and floppy ears! Grass seeds are like little barbed arrows that work their way down into your dog's ear canal, or between their toes and under the skin or even behind their eyelids. On rare occasions the grass seeds have been known to work their way under the skin, and up into your pet's abdomen or chest causing large internal abscesses which can be life threatening. Any swellings or sudden discomfort with their ears, feet or eyes please let us know. If caught quickly these can often be removed whilst your pet is awake, but if they become very well embedded then more in depth treatment can be required under sedation or general anaesthetic.

Now off to the shop...



At a recent management committee meeting Preschool representatives asked if the green area at the side of the hall could be made safe and used by Preschool children.

The garden area was allocated to the Scouts many years ago and so, with their agreement the area outside the Pin code door is being made into a secure garden for Preschool children and Beaver Scouts.

The whole area had to be cleared and a big thank you to John Gunson who helped Jerry and Richard dig up tree roots and cut away bushes.

A big thank you to Douglas as he was able to take away and dispose of the debris.

On a very wet Saturday morning committee members Alex and David joined Richard and Jerry in a working party that drilled, sanded and varnished the posts and rails ready for a picket fence to start to be erected. Jerry and Richard have begun assembling posts and rails. Here is the work so far!









Moulton Wildlife Group

We've seen the results of our labours! Many thanks to all who helped! The wild-flowers are looking beautiful with poppies, corn marigolds, phacelia, borage and cornflowers. They are attracting a number of insects too.

Of the areas we planted, the large area on The Green and the new smaller area by the church ford have been the most successful. Sadly, despite our best efforts, the patches by the river were overtaken by nettles, We also have a few small plots by the Packhorse Bridge on which a few wild flowers are appearing.

The playing field hedgerow has survived the spring drought, thanks to Douglas obtaining a bowser and watering them. We only have a few casualties.

Future work will include cutting back and clearing some of the dying wild flowers whilst leaving some seedheads for overwintering birds and future flowers.

We also have a bat box and 4 bird boxes to site with plans for a bird feeding station on the playing field by the picnic tables.

We appreciate the food items you have left for **St Peter's Pantry**. This has helped people in deepest need. The **Moulton Ministry Letter** from Rev Chris delivered to all our parishioners this summer asked for your comments and suggestions as to how we can improve our service to you and our community. Please respond to this consultation.

In June we hosted the Mildenhall Deanery Churchwarden's Oath Service when those elected were formally admitted by Archdeacon David Jenkins to serve their churches for the next twelve months.

In July Archdeacon David returned to lead the Celtic Spirituality Quiet Day for clergy and lay members from across the deanery. His theme was Pilgrimage and I include this prayer from that day.

"God, be with us in every valley, Jesus be with us on every hill, Holy Spirit be with us on every stream, every cliff's edge, every green pasture, every moor and meadow, in the crest of the waves on the sea. Every time we rest, every time we wake up; God be with us every step we take".

The 'Flower Fund' Busking Morning in June raised £212 and we much appreciated lan's musicianship, the people who came to the shop and the park and the generous donation from the Coronation Committee.
