#### **Moulton Parish Council News**

Two meetings have been held since the last edition of Moulton Matters, a meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> March and a planning meeting on 11<sup>th</sup> April. ### Village tidy up

Thank you to all the residents who took part in the village tidy up on 9<sup>th</sup> April. It was great to see so many people working together to help keep Moulton free from litter.

### **Speeding**

Speeding remains a huge concern for the Parish Council. Three speed surveys were carried out on the roads near Moulton Primary School and the results were shocking. In one week, 26,373 cars were recorded travelling at speeds of more than 25mph within the 20mph school safety zone. The Parish Council has written to Police and Crime Commissioner Tim Passmore and Chief Constable Steve Jepp to highlight the very real problem of speeding in rural communities and to ask for more enforcement, but with little success to date. The Parish Council is also in discussion with Suffolk County Council about ways to reduce speeding along Newmarket Road. Options include physical measures such as a new bend warning sign and SLOW markings. Another option would be to try and get the speed limit reduced to 40mph, but these costs would have to be met by Moulton Parish Council and have been estimated by Suffolk County Council at up to £10,000. Suffolk County Council would also have to decide whether there is sufficient justification for a reduced speed limit.

### West Suffolk Council's Preferred Options Consultation

West Suffolk Council's Preferred Options consultation will take place from May - July 2022. West Suffolk Council will be seeking views on suggested sites which may be suitable for development. There are two potential sites in Moulton which will be part of the Preferred Options Consultation. Moulton Parish Council will hold a meeting during the consultation period to discuss

these proposed sites and resident will be welcome to come along and give their views. For more information visit:

- Clear details of the problem being reported, for example the length, width and depth of a pothole.
- Photos if possible.

**Vandalism along Brookside.** The Parish Council was disappointed to learn that the 'Do not park on the grass signs' along Brookside have been pulled up and damaged by vandals.

The Parish Council is trying to establish who the vandals are before deciding what action to take.

### From The Vicarage

I was a little taken aback by a comment made at a recent discussion group here when a new adult Christian told me that he was 'seeking wisdom' through knowledge. I think that as Christians in church and groups we often think we are simply seeking knowledge but as I have reflected, I realise that he might be right. What do you think? Isn't wisdom what we all seek in this world? Wisdom is defined in the Oxford English Dictionary as 'the quality of having experience, knowledge, and good judgement; the quality of being wise:' Isn't that what we all want? Surely to have a 'right judgment in all things' is good?

We all approach the quest to understand our lives and purpose on this earth in different ways and that might be called 'Spirituality'. Wynne in 2013 says 'Spirituality' is 'The search for meaning hope and purpose in life'. Some of us have assumed that simply seeking a deeper knowledge of Christianity can give us this 'wisdom' and a better life, but they don't necessarily follow.

As the Christian Church we are challenged to tell that knowledge of our faith and Jesus himself will give satisfaction and contentment. I hope all the organisations and civil authorities of the parish will be represented in giving thanks for the life and example of our Queen who has such obvious wisdom. She has found her faith to be the basis of her life of service, following the Servant King himself.

A good friend of mine always finishes his e mails with a quote and this one is apt.

'Knowledge is knowing that a tomato is a fruit. Wisdom is knowing not to put it into a fruit salad'.

### The Green - Wildlife and Bee Area

The first flowers are appearing, attracting butterflies, ladybirds and other insects. We've added some perennial flowers – e.g. snowdrops, wood avens, wild clary and yellow rattle. We'll continue to work in this area and keep the more invasive species in check.

In the small copse behind the climbing frame, we've started to plant a few wildflowers and cleared out and replanted some of the small hazels, which are prolific. It's all work in progress.

### **Community Speed Watch**

Over the past twelve months we have been somewhat limited to sessions due to Covid and some issues with the speed gun which has now been resolved with a new gun which has an improved range on the old one and its smaller and lighter.

We continue to operate at the three sites Newmarket Road, Dalham Road and outside the school.

Speeding over 35mph continues to be about 15% of all vehicles passing which is unacceptable. Recently a car was clocked at 61mph in Newmarket Road leaving the village, there is no way it could have stopped if a small child, elderly person or dog/cat had wandered into the road.

Speed watch is effective at the time its carried out because we notice some vehicles slowing down when they see us or the signs, but its too quickly forgotten so we need to look at more effective ways of reducing speed on a daily basis.

We continue to look for more people to assist us and I am also looking for someone to take over the running of Speed watch as I have held the role for over six years, I would be able to provide all the training and support to anyone interested and still attend some sessions. I would like to thank everyone who has assisted over the past year.


in Holywell Row. It is so tasty and worth having every night for the whole season!





### **How Lucky We Are**



### Summer, Nature's Wheel and the Mouse

As we all walk round the Nature Wheel, Summer Solstice (June 21) marks moving into three Summer months. Grandmother Nature is displaying in full glory her gifts, the new begnnings of spring are now devleoping into explosions of life, colour, vibrancy and maximum potency.

The Mouse is the main teacher of the South, reminding us that whatever size something is, through our wise eyes we can see the attributes, qualities and skills that are being displayed. Mouses' skills include the agility of moving closer towards fine detail, examining intrinsic elements from all angles with clear focus and, at the same time being sensitve to the surrounding landscape. We can see or smell what is under our noses!

Getting close to things or others develops our awarness that comes through feelings and touch. To experience something we are somehow touched by it. To feel touched is a somatic expeirnece. Throughout time what rich, incredible writings, music, art and many other forms of expression are bourne out of how people feel, what they are expeirencing, what has touched them emotionally, physically, spiritually, psychologically.

Our Emotions can be regulated, calm, in turmoile, chaotic, comfortable, uncomfortable and sometimes a mix of all of these! Through our personal development, we can identify the difference between human pain that is a natural part of life, and the personal suffering that is created through our internal dymanics, views and attitudes. These internal elements are directly followed by our moods, our emotional weather and how we connect and disconnect.

Our skills can be over or under applied, either will eventually create patterns and suffering. The Nature Wheel can support us to step back and reflect on which skill's could help a situation and how we can

apply these to support ours or others momentum, collaboration and motivation.

When we are feeling strained we have many options that include blaming others or life. This may (usually) blocks access to our wise insight, personal development and respectful exchange. Another option is to consider which Eagle or Mouse skills would encourage our movement towards emotional regulation, mind balance for these are the foundations of collaboration and growth.



So may we enable Summer to warm our spirit and bones, feel the blast from Natures Summer lifeforce, and step back and observe. Thank you for reading!

### Moulton's Pipeline (Part 1)

During the discussions on the District Local Plan last year there was mention of the water pipeline that runs through Moulton. Relatively few Villagers were aware of its existence, although there are some septuagenarians Moultonians who can remember it being built. Our pipeline in Moulton actually forms part of a much bigger regional water system that keeps Ely dry and Essex wet! The Fens need less water in the Winter and Essex wants more water in the Summer.

Even as far back as 1642, Vermuyden, the Dutch water engineer that drained the Fens, had suggested a catch-water channel to collect flood waters from the three rivers east of the Fens (The Lark, Little Ouse and Wissey). The major floods in 1947 badly affected the Fens. Two fifths of the flood waters came from these three Rivers. The solution was to build a 'cut off channel' opened in 1964 which diverts water from the River Lark through Lark Head Sluice at Barton Mills. You cross over this channel every time you visit the Council 'tip' at Mildenhall. The channel links with the Little Ouse and the River Wissey before ending up at the Denver Sluice. A further channel was cut from Denver to take the flood water out to the Wash.

That dealt with the flood risk, but by the 1960s major housebuilding programmes had started in Essex. But they realised that Essex was going to run out of water. The Reservoirs in Essex were emptying out.

And so came the idea of using the channel to help take water in the opposite direction from the Denver Sluice during the Summer over 90 miles to the Essex reservoirs. By careful control of the sluices the water will flow back inland. But it needed some additional pipeline to complete the journey, and that's where Moulton plays a part – see Part 2 in the next Moulton Matters

### **Moulton Responds to Ukraine Misery**

Watching the scale of carnage unfold in Ukraine is truly appalling. Cluster bombs, rockets, and artillery shells are unlikely to fall upon Moulton any time soon and seeing the misery in Ukraine compelled me to approach our Community with a notion that might make a difference.

My original plan was to busk in the park but it soon became evident that an indoor Benefit Concert would be possible. A few 'phone calls later all the organisational ducks were swimming in a very disciplined row. After promoting the occasion over social media, the village really started buzzing. Donations of cash and raffle prizes accrued; New Moulton Stores & P.O. provided a vital hub for donations and raffle tickets; many kind folks offered practical support with their time, skills and energy. Our community project was truly launched.

I had previously seen Jancis Harvey a few times in Waitrose, and we decided to get together to play some music once Covid restrictions were lifted. I am lightyears behind the experience and talent of Jancis but was confident that our styles would balance. They did, and my own musicality grew during the process!

Our Village Hall was full on the night of the concert. At the door a large glass vase was available for donations, and it was soon obvious that a substantial amount was accumulating. Project Treasurer, Bob Saltmarsh, oversaw the accounting from the start. By his final count of donations and raffle, £1590.20 was raised, with more than half of that being donated at the concert. A significantly poignant moment occurred when a young brother and sister arrived and donated obvious pocket money. The little lad opening his "dinosaur" savings box and tipping its entire contents into the vase!

Bob has dispatched your very generous donations to the front-line charities in Ukraine via facilities provided by World Vision, which is part of the Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC), and supported by the UK Government, as well as being linked with the St Edmundsbury & Ipswich Diocesan Bishop's Appeal for Lent. This magnificent outcome celebrates our superb Community Spirit, and represents a total joint effort, with lots of us doing what we can for Ukraine people at their time of desperate need.
